STOP THE COST AND GET THE EMPLOYEE BACK TO WORK

The Southeastern Pennsylvania Transportation Authority's (SEPTA) workers' compensation program has seen some amazingly positive results without investing millions of dollars. TAKING CONTROL OF INCREASING MEDICAL COSTS
